"Restricted" electives (Maximum 15 cr.) - Any college level courses considered professional/technical courses. E.g. CFS, DES, INFO, ITC, MIC, SHS, as well as Service Learning, Coop Ed, Travel Study, Work Experience, Library courses, etc.

Special Requirements: NOT additional credits but taken as part of Distribution or Elective requirements.

Courses may fulfill more than one special requirement. Example: HUM 105 can fulfill an IS, C, and US special requirement in a single course.
